

## **ADMISSIONS POLICY 2025**

Date: March 2024 Policy Review Cycle: Annually Review Assigned to: Conyers Local Governing Body All governing bodies are required by Section 37 of the Children and Families Act 2014 to admit to the school a child with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan that names the school. This is not an oversubscription criterion. This relates only to children who have undergone statutory assessment and for whom a final EHC Plan has been issued. Where there are more applications for a school than there are places available, places will be allocated in order using the oversubscription criteria.

If there are other family situations where there are different carers such as aunts, uncles or grandparents, each case will be considered individually.

## Siblings in Sixth Form

If a parent applies for a place in Year 7 at Convers School and at the same time applies for a place in sixth form for an older child who has not previously attended Convers School, even if the older child is offered a place, this will not be classed as a sibling link. If you have a child who is attending Convers Sixth Form and will still be there when a younger brother or sister starts in the same school, this will be classed as a sibling link. If the older child is in Year 11 at Convers School and is transferring to sixth form (meeting the entry requirements) when the younger brother or sister starts at the school, this will be classed as a sibling link.
